MULTIPLICATION AND COLLABORATION

By God's grace, our impact is growing. What's our strategy? We pray for God to open doors to empower workers in underserved regions. When He does, we aim for multiplication and serve in collaboration with God and His people. A story from Ukraine and Moldova illustrates this.

In 2021, we got a call from Mission Eurasia. They said that Christian workers in the former Soviet Union need tools to form stewards and to help churches and ministries follow standards for sustainability. We had been praying for Eurasia, so we collaborated to translate *The Sower, The Choice*, and *The Council* for Russian readers. Then, God made a way for a strategic trip.

Dr. Michael Cherenkov and I traveled through Ukraine and Moldova and engaged 560 people in church, seminary, and university groups. *God brought us together from the East and the West. The visit ignited multiplication!* Many applied the teaching and tools and have reported fruit!

That's just one story! Even as the colorful stacking dolls, known as *matryoshka* or *babushka*, have much more inside them, this report offers a deeper picture of our progress in 2021-2022 for which we praise God. With you!

PURPOSE

In obedient service to Jesus Christ, Global Trust Partners multiplies faithful stewards and mobilizes peer accountability groups to build trust and to grow local generous giving to God's work.

As of 1 July 2021, GTP had served a global network of 4,055 stewards in 104 countries. By 30 June 2022, our global network expanded to 5,181 stewards in 110 (listed at right).

Our program work (aiming at multiplication) and partnership efforts (through collaboration) engaged 28% more people with the GTP purpose in 2021-2022.

PROGRAMS: TARGETING MULTIPLICATION



TEACHING

As fewer stewards engaged online, we shifted from teaching as many stewards as possible to teaching receptive groups (both onsite and online) in new countries.

Teaching strengthened 2,297 stewards from 27 countries in 2021-2022 (as compared to 3,307 stewards from 89 countries in 2020-2021).



To aim for multiplication, we trained stewards and started equipping trainers to replicate trainings both onsite and online.

Training empowered **864** stewards from **45** countries to help ministries follow standards in 2021-2022 (as compared to 2,886 in 80 countries in 2020-2021). Also **11** trainers replicated trainings for another **266** people.



We provided various capacity building services to peer accountability groups (PAGs) to help grow their membership and reach to new countries.

Teamwork served **11** PAGs accrediting members in **15** countries in 2021-2022 (as compared to 11 PAGs in 14 countries in 2020-2021).





We surveyed the global network to enhance our digital resources in 2022-2023.

Toolbox reported 27,103 downloads of GTP ebooks and templates and 925 video views in 2021-2022 (as compared to 14,235 downloads and 2,074 video views in 2020-2021).

PARTNERSHIP: ENGAGING COLLABORATION



We started Monthly Global Prayer Hour to invite the world to pray with us.

Our Prayer Journal subscription list grew **161.2%** from 116 intercessors last year to **303** this year.



We activated the Inspiring Stewards podcast, sent 24 Journal Entry emails, and posted 8 impact stories, 8 blogs, and 7 field reports.

As our global network grew **28%** wider from 4,055 to 5,181 stewards, our email open rates also went up from 35.1% to **36.0%**. More people engage with GTP than ever



We celebrated global financial support and formed the GTP Trust Fund this year to receive complex gifts.

Praise God for record giving: \$611,614 from 209 giving units in **47** countries (up from \$524,725 from 179 giving units in 31 countries last year).





We scaled to meet growing demand by adding staff and collaborating with organizational partners.

GTP had 5 staff, 12 regional facilitators, 12 board members and 5 organizational partners last year. This year we have 10 staff, 12 regional facilitators, 12 board members, and 11 organizational partners

PROGRAMS

GTP has four programs that staff deliver 2x2 with regional facilitators: Teaching, Training, Teamwork, and Toolbox.

TEACHING

We deliver biblical instruction to form stewards who can teach others about faithful administration and help ministries flourish.



TEAMWORK

We collaborate with regional facilitators to serve national workers and help them set up or strengthen local peer accountability groups.



We offer two types: responsive trainings address regional needs and replicable trainings empower participants to train others globally.



TOOLBOX

We provide digital resources to individuals and matching grants to groups to help them grow trust and greater local giving.

TEACHING

We delivered biblical and practical teaching online and onsite. The topics ranged from strengthening churches and ministries for sustainability to biblical governance to growing local giving and using the GTP Diagnostic Tool and Templates for building capacity.

Our research has revealed that onsite work builds relationships with receptive workers. Then, they tend to tap into our online offerings and share them with others. For this reason, we intentionally aim to engage and resource people in new countries, not for numeric growth. This helps us target multiplication with a small staff.

This year we taught in 6 new countries: Belize, Eswatini, Malawi, Moldova, Mozambique, and Ukraine. To widen engagement and increase our impact, we entered these countries in collaboration with local, national, and/or regional partners.







TEACHING MULTIPLICATION AND COLLABORATION WITH NETWORKS

Here's an example of multiplication and collaboration related to teaching. On our trip to Ukraine and Moldova, we delivered biblical teaching in partnership with these ministries. The visit produced much fruit, some of which we celebrate in the testimony below.





"Seminar participants appreciated how Dr. Gary Hoag facilitated the session. He began by asking about the challenges and he delivered biblical teaching and offered practical suggestions in response to the sharing from the audience. All the students who participated in the seminar wrote papers on stewardship and generosity. PALMFUL OF MAIZE MULTIPLYING TEACHERS IN COLLABORATION WITH STUM



Inspired by Handful of Rice from India and in partnership with STUM (Sunday School Teachers United Movement) and GenerousChurch, GTP launched Palmful of Maize in 2022 to teach the joy of giving as a reflection of true Christianity to all the children of Malawi. Celebrate with us that the teachers of Malawi are spreading this vision widely.

Palmful of Maize stats

(as of 30 September 2022):

- **1,728** teachers trained in **12** of 28 districts in Malawi
- **12,560** learners participating in Palmful of Maize (POM)
- **284** churches actively engaging learning participants
- 13,050 kg of maize contributed, all of it stays in each district and is divided in three ways:
 - 80% of it shared with the poor with district committee oversight
 - 10% is sold locally and funds the administration of this vision in Malawi
 - 10% is sold locally and funds the advancement of the vision to other African countries

TRAINING

This year, we took 3 steps to scale training for multiplication: We added a learning management system (LMS). We hired three staff members. And we began actively mobilizing trainers.

For our LMS, we picked Pathwright to facilitate online learning in cohorts. Our first offering on the LMS is On Demand Journey of Empowerment (ODJ). Learners go through ODJ at their own pace in their timezone.

As for staff, we hired Gabrielle Fortunato of South Africa to work as Regional Trainer for Africa. She facilitates ODJ for the world, and Stations of Generosity and the Generosity Design Lab (GDL) for sub-Saharan Africa. She has already tapped volunteers to train with her. Later, we added Jon Devadas of Malaysia to provide the same service to Southeast Asia, and Prakash Chandra Giri of Nepal as Curriculum Developer to build out more offerings on the LMS.

Onsite in 2021-2022, we facilitated JOE in Belize and Guatemala. Then, for example, in Belize 6 trained trainers replicated it for another 158 people. Multiplication is happening!

GENEROSITY DESIGN LAB MULTIPLYING GIVERS IN COLLABORATION WITH GENEROUSCHURCH



Ereny Monir added the Generosity Design Lab (GDL) to our list of trainings, thanks to our partnership with GenerousChurch. The GDL is an interactive experience over two or three days that results in the creation of a contextualized generosity curriculum for a network. In 2021–2022, GTP facilitated GDLs with groups from Egypt, the Philippines, and Indonesia.

TEAMWORK

We often say at GTP: "Teamwork makes the dream work!" It's true all the time and relates closely our work this past year.

In August 2021, GTP collaborated to host "AfCAA @ 5" to celebrate 5 years of accrediting churches and ministries across Africa. We held an online event that introduced their members, explained their standards, and raised \$11,100 to help them build capacity.

In June 2022, GTP activated peer accountability in Papua New Guinea by resourcing a team of volunteers—Joshua Harber (PNG), Steve Kerr (Australia), Naomi Siawarta (Indonesia), and Anjji Gabriel (Philippines)—who partnered to host an event in Port Moresby.

In early July 2022, we co-hosted a launch event and a series of awareness dinners with ICCSA (Indonesian Council for Christian Stewardship and Accountability). These activities gave them a boost! Member registrations have gone from two to four, with six more pending and eight in the pipeline.







TEAMWORK MULTIPLICATION AND COLLABORATION WITH PAGs

"The Fellowship of Peer Accountability Groups" as we like to describe them work together to advance "biblically faithful, globally consistent, and locally contextualized standards" around the world. We facilitate collaboration to help get new PAGs started!

STRATEGIC PARTNERS

SPIRITUAL PRIORITIES

At GTP, we practice the spiritual priorities of prayer, fasting, and confession to discern the direction of our service from God.

As staff, we engage these priorities annually to discern faithful activities that can position us for fruitful outcomes. With regional facilitators, we do them to discern next steps based on what God has done, is doing, and where we sense He is leading us.

These priorities guide our teamwork to engage where God is at work, to advance His purposes, and to bring Him glory.

With strategic partners, we practice them to set aside our plans and discover God's agenda for our collective work.

TOOLBOX

At GTP, we say we resource stewards in 3D: Directory, Diagnostic Tool, and Digital Resources.

The Directory helps givers locate accredited churches and ministries in 15 countries: Australia, Canada, Egypt, Ghana, Guatemala, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Nigeria, Philippines, South Africa, South Korea, Switzerland, USA, and Zimbabwe.

Our Diagnostic Tool and Templates have been used by workers from 41 countries. Last year, it was available in English and Spanish. This year, at the European Great Commission Collaboration summit in Prague, we released it in Czech and Slovak in partnership with 4D Ministries.

Our Digital Files are widely downloaded in English. Strategic collaboration with Latin American workers has helped grow the reach of our Spanish resources. After our trip to Ukraine, GTP provided books for Russian readers in collaboration with Mission Eurasia.










SERVICE


We do our work with the oversight of 12 board members, the work of 10 staff, and the volunteer commitment of 12 regional facilitators.


PRAYER



Our statement of functional expenses showed that we invested 69% in program services (up from 63% last year), 22% in general and administrative expenses (down from 30% last year), and 9% on fundraising (up from 7% last year).

GENERAL & ADMINISTRATIVE 22% \$118,041

Why the shift in funding allocation? Program services rose as travel and onsite events resumed. General and administrative costs dropped the staff size remained constant most of the fiscal year. Our auditors continue to applaud our financial health and functional expenses.

GTP TRUST FUND COLLABORATING WITH MB FOUNDATION TO GROW GIVING TO GTP

WHY ESTABLISH THE GTP TRUST FUND?

This bold step positions GTP to receive complex and major gifts of assets for strategic projects that would not normally be funded by the general budget. It positions GTP for long-term impact.

The GTP Trust Fund is not an endowment. All gifts will be invested and expended to ensure the perpetuity of the GTP purpose. Both the principal and interest will be administrated by and available to the GTP board to resource the ongoing work of GTP.

HOW DOES THE GTP BOARD PLAN TO MANAGE THE GTP TRUST FUND?

The GTP Trust Fund will be stewarded in accordance with the GTP Investment Policy to maximize asset values in the short-term to fuel strategic efforts in the long run. That means the resources will be utilized by GTP in a God-honoring manner to grow further income and maximize program investment. With board approval, GTP will use these funds for special projects, regional activities, and international summits.
