

ORDER AND OVERSIGHT

l left you behind in Crete for this reason, so that you should put in order what remained to be done and should appoint elders in every town, as I directed you. Titus 1:5

We can trace the growth of the early church back to these instructions from Paul to Titus. Paul knew that every church needed two things to flourish with sustainability in a world filled with hostility: order and oversight. The early church councils reveal the presence of both.

In 325, at the Council of Nicaea, 318 overseers from across the Mediterranean world drafted a creed to proclaim the divinity of Jesus and bring unity to the church. In 381, at the First Council of Constantinople (now Istanbul), 150 overseers added words about the Holy Spirit. This resulted in the Nicene Creed (see next page) and reveals the power of order and oversight.

In October 2023, I spoke at the World Evangelical Alliance Future of the Gospel Forum in Istanbul, Turkey. On that trip, I got to visit the Hagia Irene (pictured on the cover) where the 150 overseers of the First Council of Constantinople met and made the final edits to the Nicene Creed beneath the cross on the ceiling (pictured on next page).

This experience renewed my zeal to spread order and oversight worldwide with GTP. Like Paul, we teach stewards to follow standards to have order and to implement governance with peer accountability to ensure oversight. Order and oversight positioned the early church for unity and sustainability. Enjoy the GTP 2024 Annual Report to see the impact of this today.

This report contains crosses, windows, and steps. The crosses represent the presence and power of Christ. The windows mark opportunities. And the steps reflect our work. We also included more pictures of people who serve with us. Praising God for the progress and these people!

GTP has 4 programs: Teaching, Training, Teamwork, and Toolbox. Staff deliver them 2x2 with board members, regional facilitators, country coordinators, course moderators, church ambassadors, and others. TEACHING

We deliver biblical instruction to form stewards who can teach others about faithful administration and help ministries flourish with governance.



TRAINING

We offer on demand certificate courses and onsite replicable trainings to empower participants to spread accountability and generosity in their context.



TEAMWORK

We collaborate with regional facilitators, country coordinators, and their country teams to serve national workers and help set up and strengthen peer accountability groups.



TOOLBOX

We provide digital resources for stewards and make matching grants available for peer accountability groups to help them build capacity to grow trust and local giving to God's work.

GTP trained and deployed 316 stewards in 20 countries to replicate Stations of Generosity to multiply faithful stewards in their contexts.



GTP received a 5-year grant from the Lilly Endowment to bring order and oversight to Spanish- and Chinese-speaking churches in the USA and abroad. EVENTS IN AUSTRALIA AND SERVICE IN UKRAINE

In Adelaide, Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth, and Sydney, CMA Standards Council delivered the Inaugural Annual Address. GTP helped activate the CMA Fundraising Network for Australia.







GTP partnered with Mission Eurasia to provide books for Russian readers across the former Soviet Union. GTP also rallied emergency aid for Christian workers planting churches with order and oversight and serving war-torn people needing bread, water, and shelter.

GTP engages people in partnership work in 4 areas: prayer, communications, transparency, and service. We take faithful steps to invite participation with us and celebrate any growth as a gift from God. As GTP grows and fruit abounds on the trees of those we serve, the Kingdom of God expands. PRAYER

We send Prayer Journal every first week of the month, gather for Monthly Global Prayer Hour (third Wednesday each month), and monthly host regional prayer for Africa, Asia, and Latin America.



COMMUNICATIONS

We send Journal Entry to the GTP Global Network every two weeks and other emails monthly to rally stewards to give, pray, and serve with us and to promote GTP tools on social media regularly.



TRANSPARENCY

We have independent auditors do a full financial audit, comply with ECFA standards, and renew ECFA accreditation annually to build trust and to grow global generous giving to GTP.



SERVICE

Our 14 staff live in 14 countries and collaborate with 12 board members, 12 regional facilitators, 71 country coordinators, 60 course moderators, and many other strategic volunteers.





EXPENSES

Our statement of functional expenses showed that we invested 78% in program services in (up from 72%), 15% in general and administrative costs (down from 21%), and 7% on fundraising (same as last year).

Why the shifts? Program services rose as travel and events increased. Fundraising remained unchanged. General and administrative expenses decreased as efficiency rose. Our auditors applaud our financial health.

GTP TRUST FUND

GTP established the GTP Trust Fund at MB Foundation in 2022. We report here the year-end balance, annual return, gifts received, and amount distributed to GTP for program work.

WHY DID GTP ESTABLISH THE GTP TRUST FUND?

GTP created this fund to provide a place for givers to make large gifts for multi-year impact. This fund enables GTP to receive asset gifts such as stocks, gifts of property, or other complex gifts. GTP counts gifts to this fund as separate from giving to the general operating budget.

The GTP Trust Fund is not an endowment. GTP invests and expends both principal and interest each year to manage the growth of GTP and ensure the perpetuity of our purpose and programs. By design, the GTP Trust Fund balances short-term stability and long-term impact.

HOW DOES THE GTP BOARD MANAGE THE GTP TRUST FUND?

The GTP board stewards the assets in the GTP Trust Fund in accordance with the GTP Investment Policy to maximize asset values in the short-term to fuel strategic efforts in the long run. This ensures that GTP uses the resources in a Godhonoring manner to grow further income and maximize program investment. With board approval, GTP uses these funds for supporting work such as capacity building, special projects, regional activities, and international summits.



PEOPLE

GTP has grown thanks to **order and oversight**. Our staff preserves **order** by following the ECFA standards of responsible stewardship, and our board provides the **oversight**. **Order and oversight** come together to enhance trust and encourage the strategic service of many volunteers. See their roles below and their faces and places of service on the following pages.



BOARD

GTP has a governing board who meets quarterly. They steward the purpose and vision of GTP. Their main function is accountability.



STAFF

GTP has 14 staff who live in 14 countries. They work full-time to engage the global network to participate in our purpose and vision.



REGIONAL FACILITATORS

GTP has 12 regional facilitators. They live in the 12 regions of the Lausanne Movement and serve as key volunteers.



COUNTRY COORDINATORS

GTP has 71 country coordinators who link people in their countries and territories with GTP programs and sort logistics for onsite work.



COURSE MODERATORS

GTP has 4 on demand courses. With 60 course moderators, we make them available to stewards in 133 countries and territories.



OTHER VOLUNTEERS

GTP also has other volunteers who serve in a variety of capacities. We acknowledge their unique contributions with deep gratitude.
