AIM #1 - DO GOVERNANCE SEMINARS WITH CIM IN MUMBAI AND NEW DELHI TO RAISE AWARENESS AND RALLY ACCREDITATIONS FOR NOBLERANK.

We report 3 fruits. Fruit #1: Equipped. Many said they had never received such teaching and loved this seminar. The feedback included gratitude for getting a biblical foundation, practical tools and templates, advice for application in India, and time throughout the day for group discussion. Fruit #2: Educated. Dr. Aby, Dr. Gary, Dr. Mercia (pictured top left), Ms. Rebecca (pictured top right), and CA Dr. Sanjay (pictured bottom left collaborated with CA Mr. Raja B. Singh (pictured bottom right) and Mrs. Sonia Daniel (pictured middle left) to teach and educate skilled workers to take their governance to new levels. Fruit #3. Enthusiasm. Praise God, 11 stewards in Mumbai and 19 in New Delhi registered enthusiastic interest in getting accredited by NobleRank, the peer accountability group accrediting churches and ministries for complying with standards in India. AIM #2 - DISCERN DIRECTION FOR GTP ACTIVITIES IN 2025 ON A RETREAT WITH THE GTP REGIONAL FACILITATOR FOR SOUTH ASIA AND GTP COUNTRY COORDINATOR FOR INDIA.



We report 4 fruits. Fruit #1: Convene. Rebecca, Mercia, and Gary left the New Delhi event (GTP, CIM, and NobleRank team pictured above) on 13 January and flew to Hyderabad for our discernment retreat which ended early on 16 January 2025. This put us there for the IMA meetings (see last page). Fruit #2: Connection. Mercia's 3D centers on the link between CIM and GTP. Look for us to work together on an online "International Consultation on Enterprise Risk Management for Churches and Nonprofits" in May 2025, on onsite program work in India in August 2025, and on demand courses. Fruit #3: Collaboration. GTP and NobleRank sync well. Onsite GTP program work surfaces accreditation leads for NobleRank. GTP on demand courses strengthen stewards. GTP actively serves 600+ workers in India and points them to NobleRank. Also GTP and NobleRank have started serving a pilot group of India Missions Association (IMA) agencies. IMA serves 317 organizations, 60,000+ missionaries, and 300,000+ national workers. We hope to do an India Collaboration pilot group too. Fruit #4: Countries. Gary and Rebecca opened Bangladesh with Prakash Chandra Giri of Nepal, GTP Curriculum Developer, and envision opening Nepal and Sri Lanka later in 2025.

The 4 parts of council mindset, so brilliantly brought out by Gary and based on the Bible, are amazing lessons not to be missed by any Board member of a Christian Institution.

AIM #3 - DEDICATE TIME TO STRENGTHEN RELATIONSHIPS WITH KEY INDIVIDUALS AND INSTITUTIONS IN HYDERABAD, MUMBAI, AND NEW DELHI.

We report 3 fruits. Fruit #1: Hyderabad. Two key meetings happened in Hyderabad. On 9 January Anand Joshua met with key India Collaboration (IC) workers at Olive Technology and shot two videos related to governance (top photo below). One for the IC board and one for the ministry workers IC serves. On 14 January, Gary, Mercia, and Rebecca representing GTP, NobleRank, and CIM, joined Arpit Waghmare, Isac Raja, and others to discuss the NobleRank standards, the pilot group, and the August 2025 conference. God moved in a big way as Isac Raja's comments explain (photo at right). Fruit #2: New Delhi. Gary preached at Delhi Bible Fellowship on 12 January and had quality time with the Patra family (middle photo below). Fruit #3: Mumbai. Gary told Raja B. Singh that he had a 30 hour layover in Mumbai on 21 January so Raja planned an event "The Heart of Generosity" with the Logos Management Club (see bottom photo). This generated more interest in generosity and the link to accountability and leads for Rebecca.
