



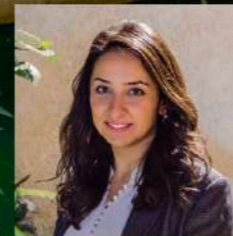

JOE has four objectives in view for participants. JOE aims to:

1

Develop real stewards who know who they are and understand how God has positioned them to influence their countries.

2

Open the eyes of participants to discover that God's pathway to flourishing is found through fasting, confession, and prayer.

3

Equip people to empower others to take this trust journey so that together they can turn brokenness into blessing and transform individuals and institutions.

4

Inspire real stewards in every region and country of the world to hold each other accountable to follow standards together.

Why share JOE and with whom?

1. Pray, pray, pray
2. Live in the ambiguity of the questions
3. Invite participation from the entire group
4. Use open questions to get people talking
5. Primarily use stories
6. Lead with weakness when appropriate
7. There is an agenda
8. Be yourself
9. Share your own story
10. Relax
11. Allow the flexible schedule to work for you
12. No two JOE experiences are the same
13. Keep to the schedule
14. Trust the process

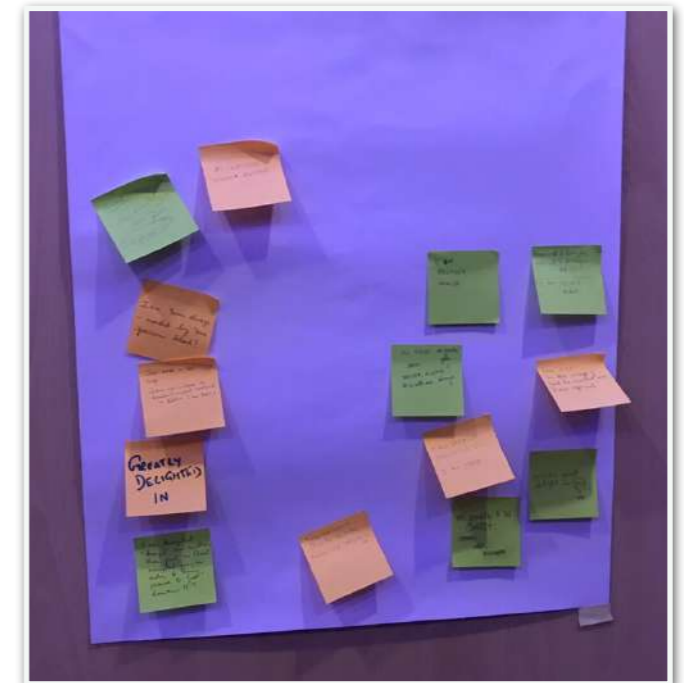

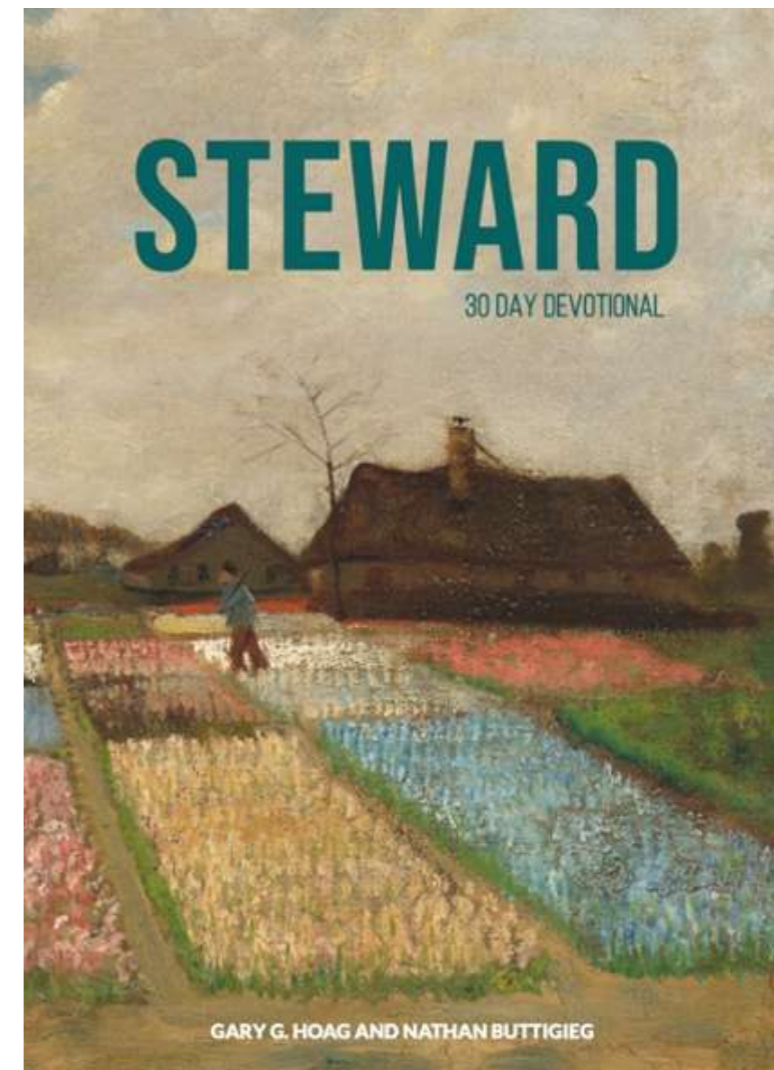
